#### Friday, May 3, 2024



Dr. Gerard Lemongello - 4 CEUs for D, H, A, L A Systematic Approach to Comprehensive Treatment Planning for Aesthetics and Function - Mastering Treatment Planning for Aesthetics and Function can be challenging. One of the most challenging areas for most dentists is the process of combining

the aesthetic examination with the principles of the functional examination to create a treatment plan for success. This program is designed to simplify the entire process from examination through presentation and will provide a systematic, step-by-step approach to treatment planning. It integrates esthetics, occlusion, restoration, and periodontics into a logical format that provides confidence in developing the final treatment plan.

#### Participants will learn:

- How to complete a comprehensive exam.
- What a complete examination must include.
- Information you must have from the exam prior to treatment
- The four major areas that need to be considered in treatment planning.
- Facial esthetics and evaluation of how the face alters esthetic
- The esthetic factors that must be addressed in planning.
- The role occlusion plays in modifying the esthetic plan.
- Periodontal considerations necessary to treatment plan for success.
- How to determine if orthodontics is a necessary part of the plan.

Advanced Case Planning and Treatment - This segment of this course will include the diagnosis and treatment of the complex case. The principles illustrated will be shown in a step-by-step manner from initial exam to completion of the case. Cases presented will include: Full mouth case with and without change to vertical dimension; the Class II Division II crowded case; the severe wear case; the Class III case.

#### Participants will learn:

- How to complete a diagnostic work up and what it includes.
- Creation of the diagnostic wax up.
- All necessary stents, guides, and matrices to aid in preserving or altering vertical dimension of occlusion.
- Preparation design for veneers, veneer onlays, or full coverage crowns.
- Bite registration involving full mouth restoration including cross mounting provisional models and the custom incisal guide table.
- Fabrication of the provisional.
- Impression techniques.
- Final case insertion and management of occlusion.



**Dr. Gregory Oxford – 4 CEUs for D, H** *Fate Follows the Furcation* - The population is living longer, retaining more teeth for longer periods, thus dental practitioners are challenged now more than ever to assess the health, longevity, and prognosis of teeth. Posterior dentition may be the most difficult

to assess and may be the most important. This program explores the etiology, evaluation, diagnosis, and classification of furcation defects with clinical, radiographic and CT/CB approaches. The program also provides the participant the opportunity to practice with handson clinical probing with models to accurately diagnosis furcation. Dr. Oxford will then discuss the treatment options, including traditional, regenerative and laser periodontal therapy. He will discuss the statistics and prognosis of the treatments decisions for teeth with furcation invasions. He will also discuss future directions utilizing stem-cell regenerative therapies.

Periodontal Maintenance of Dental Implants - The increase in dental implant therapy has been exponential in the last twenty years, however our knowledge on how to maintain the health of the fixtures has not kept pace. This program will define the components of an implant system, review an assortment of implant systems, and explore some of the most accepted methods of patients and professional maintenance. Recommendations of oral hygiene measures will be given. Additionally, this course will review the parameters of health between natural teeth and implant fixtures and discuss state of the art monitoring techniques to help ensure maintenance of health of the dental implant.

Dr. Gerard Lemongello - 4 CEUs for D, H, A, L Implant Aesthetics: Diagnosis and Treatment Planning for Predictable, Functional and Esthetic Results - Mastering the art of predictable implant aesthetics can be challenging. In order to achieve lifelike, functional results the clinician must first master the art of diagnosis and treatment planning. With the appropriate diagnosis and treatment plan, the next critical step is executing the treatment in a logical systematic way, managing expectation of the patient and achieving exceptional results. One of the most stressful areas for most dentists is the process of creating a beautiful provisional that will guide tissue and predictably achieve the aesthetic outcome for the final restoration in the aesthetic zone. Combining the use of a custom fabricated provisional abutment, provisional restoration and a custom fabricated impression coping many of the aesthetics challenges can be addressed. This program is designed to simplify and streamline the entire process of diagnosis, treatment planning, implant provisionalization, and final restoration. It will provide a systematic, step-by-step approach to mastering the critical skills in restoring implant cases. It integrates the techniques necessary in a logical format that provides confidence in developing the final restorative outcome.

Participants will learn:

- Proper treatment planning for esthetic success.
- Comparison of Implant Systems and their predictably. Choosing the right implant.
- The esthetic factors that must be addressed in planning.
- The role occlusion plays in modifying the treatment plan and esthetics.
- Periodontal considerations necessary to treatment plan for success.
- Why it is necessary and how to guide and support soft tissue during the provisional stage.
- How to fabricate a custom provisional healing abutment.
- How to fabricate a custom provisional abutment and provisional restoration.
- Screw retained vs. cement retained provisional.
- How to fabricate a custom impression coping and why it is necessary for predictable results.
- Benefits of immediate provisional.
- Laboratory fabricated provisional vs. custom fabricated provisional. Advantages/disadvantages.
- Custom provisional techniques for immediate implant placement.
- Custom provisional technique after traditional implant healing.

**Dr. Gerard J. Lemongello Jr.** graduated from the University of Florida, College of Dentistry and has been in private practice since 1987. His focus is on Comprehensive Restorative Dentistry specializing in complex restorative, cosmetic and implant dentistry.

Dr. Lemongello has also completed advanced training in

aesthetic and restorative dentistry at some of the most prestigious institutes of learning such as, The Dawson Center, The Seattle institute and the Rosenthal Institute. He completed two years additional training in Orthodontics at the United States Dental Institute. He is an Accredited member of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. AACD Accredited members have completed a comprehensive credentialling program demonstrating an exceptional level of clinical skill,

judgement and ability to perform cosmetic dentistry procedures.

He is a member of the American Dental Association, American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry, Florida Dental Association and Academy of General Dentistry and others.

Dr. Lemongello has published numerous articles in leading dental journals and lectures nationally on complex treatment planning, aesthetics and implant dentistry as well as other contemporary dental topics. in Maryland with the Navy, his Masters and Diplomate status in 1994 and his PhD from the University of Florida College of Medicine in 1998.



As a Courtesy Clinical Professor of Periodontology at the University of Florida College of Dentistry, Dr. Oxford was previously a Director of the Graduate Periodontology Program and a Clinical Research Investigator with the Periodontal Disease Research Center. He was a past recipient of a Navy Clinical Excellence Award and is a Fellow in the American and International Colleges of Dentists.

Dr. Oxford Maintains a private practice limited to periodontics, implant and surgical dentistry in St. Augustine, Florida, and was previously a co-investigator on a large NIDR grant to investigate the inter-relationship of diabetes and periodontal diseases.
